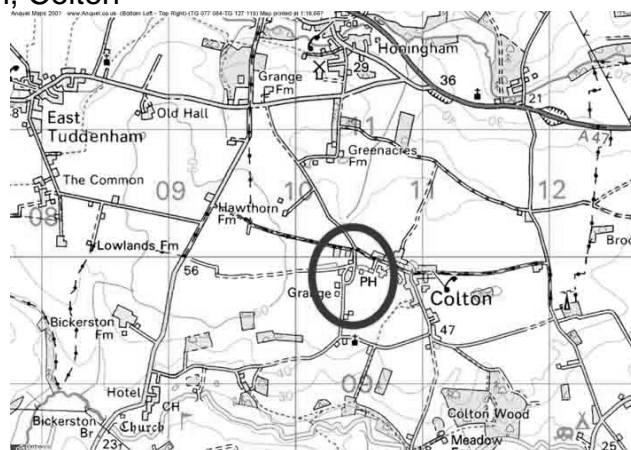
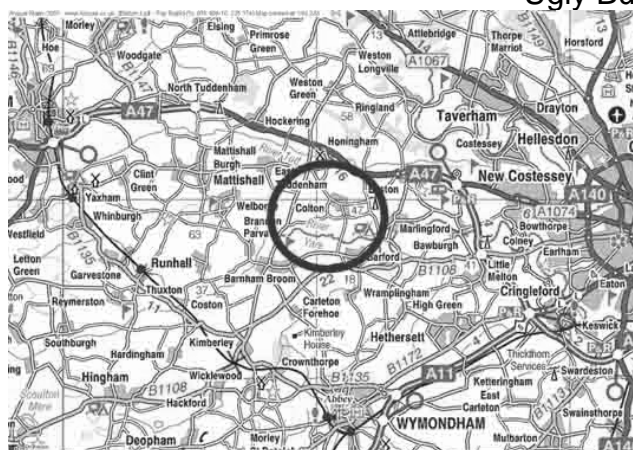

After an absence of 20 years Chelmsford Motor Club is proud to return to Brands Hatch. In the second year of title sponsorship, TRS (Essex) Ltd continue their generous support of East Anglian rallying. We are planning to run 8 all tarmac stages totalling approximately 35 miles. The first car will start at 10.00 am and we have a strict curfew of 5.30 pm, so be prepared for the last stage running into darkness..

Spectators are welcome at the venue and there will be no charge for access or parking.

Saturday 19th February 2011

The format of this new event will be run under the regulations of the Endurance Road Rally Championship and MSA Endurance Road Rally rules.

First car will leave from Sicklesmere at 10.00am on Saturday the 19th February 2011. Selective mileage will be approximately 80 miles. The evening road rally section will be very straightforward. The road book for the entire night section will be issued at the supper halt.

As with any event then marshals are the key. Although our Chief Marshal Claudia Aldridge has many offers of help, marshals are the most important people as without them there will be no event. Contact Claudia by email on cvs-vehicles@hotmail.co.uk to offer your help either setting up, on the day or packing away – or all three!

Chelmsford Motor Club is planning to run the Honington gymkhana again this year. That's the good news. The bad news is the base has stepped up security. With this in mind, we have been asked to get ALL OFFICIALS, COMPETITORS and MARSHALS to fill in their basic security form. All forms need to be back one month before the event so it is better to fill in the form and withdraw than ask for a late entry/volunteer and be refused. This is what the RAF requirement not CMC.

If you require a form, please email me your address to chiefmarshal@chelmsfordmc.co.uk and I will send a form out to you.

The security clearance will cover you for one year only on any event held at RAF Honington.

Date for the gymkhana is still to be confirmed but will be March/April. Your entry for the gymkhana will be declined if you do not fill in a form and return it to the RAF at least one month before the gymkhana date.

We would like to bombard the RAF with the security forms so that they reevaluate their security clearance for all motor clubs so I will be sending any forms I have received to them on January 23rd which is after Brands Hatch Weekend.

If you trust me enough with your information, (I promise not to read them), I will be in car 48 at Brands Hatch Stages and I will send all the forms altogether or you can send directly to RAF Honington. Please let me know if you have sent them directly though.

New Year Treasure Hunt & Scatter

2011 kicked off with the traditional offering from Ian & Gill Doble - The New Year Treasure Hunt & Scatter. This year's event was based at The Alby Horseshoes Inn and offered the opportunity for a run along the North Norfolk with an optional stroll along Cromer Pier!

For readers who still aren't quite sure what a Scatter is here is a brief overview of the club's version. At the start each crew is given a list of 40 grid square references, each square contains a feature (this year the majority of features were car parks), at each feature there is a question to answer and all you have to do is pick ¾ of the features, visit them and write down the answer to the question. It is not a race although there are penalties for a late finish; the route covers approximately 50 miles with a time allowance of 3½ hours. Most of the questions require getting out of the car to find the answers. The only 'specialist' equipment required is an OS Map.

9 crews turned up for signing on, one of the other attractions of a scatter is that your entry fee covers a car full – the more eyes the better. Our team was made up of me driving, Howard navigating and Janice scribing. One tip (as with any event) – always read the instructions carefully! Usual plan of action is to spend the first half an hour or so plotting the feature points on the map and then work out a route. This event presented a second option, drive straight to Cromer and plot the points while other team members did the pier walk. Back to reading the instructions, bonus points were on offer for collecting treasures (feather, shell, fir cone, holly leaf, rhododendron leaf).

For those plotting at the start there were two obvious route options; either travelling the coast West to

East or East to West. We went for the West to East option and appeared to be in the minority as we only spotted Jennie & Graham 'answer hunting' but did cross the path of most of the other crews round about Weybourne and then the final couple on the outskirts of Cromer.

Things started off OK with a visit to the entrance to Wolterton Park and a fairly straight forward anagram answered from the comfort of the car. Back down to earth with a bump at Mannington Hall and a taste of things to come. Several loops of the car park failed to provide the answer. One of the other features of the club version is that most of the questions have a clue pointing to where to look. With all three of us out of the car scouring the car park entrance, Howard eventually found the answer written in tiny print on a gate post.

On towards Holt for a couple of 3 pointers, one easy-ish and one not so, both requiring an out of car search. Onto the coast (via an easy 3 pointer at Wiveton Downs) and the run for home starting from Morston with the intention of finishing with the Cromer pier stroll before the dash to the finish – it's good to have a plan!

Morston car park and after several minutes wasted scouring the 'wrong bit' of the car park (should have read the instructions a bit more closely) and then the beach for a shell the plan was already looking a bit ambitious although Janice did find a feather. We were quite lucky to find the correct answer in the wrong place but dropped 1 point for not matching the required answer exactly.

Another feature of the club version is that answers have to exactly match the organisers' right down to spelling, capitalisation and

punctuation.

Onwards and eastwards; Blakeney, Cley next the Sea, Salthouse, Weybourne and Upper Sheringham for five 3 pointers, one 2 pointer (scribing error at Weybourne) and the first 0 pointer of the afternoon (driver error at Upper Sheringham). Two more 3 pointers at Sheringwood and then a 2 pointer (scribing error) at Felbrigg Hall. Back to the coast and two easy 3 pointers at West and East Runctons.

By now we had less than an hour of our allotted time left, still within budget but only just. The cunning plan left a possible 7 questions to answer and one more treasure to find. In the bank we had 19 answers and 4 treasures.

Sadly the wheels were just about to come off the plan. A 0 pointer at the cliff car park in Cromer with a lot of time wasted looking in the wrong car park and then a poor return from the pier (two 3 pointers and four zero pointers) although Howard did find the final treasure! With hindsight we should probably have skipped Cromer and gone from Felbrigg to have a go at some of the points to the east of Alby.

Fifteen minutes to get from Cromer to Alby and we were quite surprised to find we were the first ones back to the pub. With a couple of minutes spare and only 22 answers it was time to have a few 'educated' guesses at some of the missing answers. Eight guesses netted us the grand total of one extra point!

Back to reading the instructions carefully. The penalty for late arrival at the finish was 1 point for each minute (up to a maximum of 30 minutes). Statistically we had spent 180 minutes answering 22 questions which average out at

approximately 9 minutes per answer. With only 3 points available for a correct answer it is beneficial to not be late – the odd minute is OK but it is never worth trying for an extra answer once you're OTL.

Missing treasures and late penalties had a significant impact on the results which are shown below.

Congratulations to Julian & Sara on yet another convincing victory.

Thanks to Margaret & Richard at the Alby Horseshoes Inn for their hospitality, Ian & Gill for organising, Howard for donating the DVD and all the competitors for their support.

At the moment the Summer Series Championship has a couple of Scatters scheduled but this may change (keep an eye on the calendar).

There is also the re-scheduled Broads Explorer Classic Scatter

running on Sunday 17th April. Aimed at classic cars but will be open to any car with modern cars handicapped. This is running in association with Eastern Counties Motor Club with support from the Broads Authority, and will be a very straight forward social affair visiting many local visitor attractions.
