

# **The Preston Rally 2011**

With my usual Preston navigator Steve excusing himself by emigrating the New Zealand I was in search of another vietim volunteer. After putting TBA in my online entry I was contacted by Jonathan Stimpson asking if I still required a navigator. Jonathan has road rallied a few Peugeots in his time but also likes to navigate too. I offered him the seat in the Rover and we completed the entry form. As a warm up we decided to enter David Mann's 'Waveney Mushrooms' 12-car rally at the end of November.

It started at David's mushroom plant near Bungay so was quite a trek from North Norfolk. We set off in good time to get there by 7pm. As we were running novices we had to plot chunks of the route from handouts given to us before the start, with the rest being plot'n'bash. It was a good event, and Jonathan had to work hard as the roads were brand new to both of us. We pushed along and even with the plot'n'bash only dropped a minute. The route was great with lots of twisty and undulating roads. David even used an airfield and some farm tracks at the end, which was a great rehearsal for the Preston. We thought we had done reasonably well, but dropped 1 fail by missing a codeboard. Unfortunately we had driven past it and just didn't see it. It was a bit low in a gully in long grass apparently. Anyway we were still first novices and 5<sup>th</sup> overall.



Onto the Preston. The car preparation went well, with lots of underside protection and a hefty sumpguard. Some Silverstone knobblies were purchased from Ebay and we were ready to go. I thought I had better have a test run down some local whites to check all was ok. Unfortunately it wasn't. As I came to the end of a rough white I braked and the pedal nearly went to the floor. I was only a couple of miles from home so carefully limped home on the handbrake. Upon inspection a rear brake hose had come apart. The braided steel line had worn through as it was bending at the union more than it should. I checked the other side and it was going the same way. I got hold of two original rubber hoses and put them on. With rubber it will allow a lot more flexing in the pipe, so they will

be staying on the car for the foreseeable future. HEL pipes have redesigned the unions for me now but I'm not convinced this won't happen again. At least it got me the confidence back in the car. Other than the brake failure the car felt good and was ready for the challenge.

This road (ha!) rally takes it's name from the sponsor, Preston Garages of Chelmsford, not from the place in Lancashire, as many people seem to think. The start was in the usual place at the ambulance garages in Barton Mills, so not too far to travel. We were seeded at 15, a bit better than the 20 I had asked for. With out much rain in the preceding weeks it wasn't going to be the muddy affair of previous years and was going to be much faster on the harder ground. The only trouble is that you arrive at the next bump much faster and therefore hit it much harder.

We set off at 22:15 and were pretty much straight into it. There were a couple of new sections very close to the start, which weren't too rough, but we started cautiously and were only setting times in the top 30. We got caught by one car, a Nissan Sylvia, and let him past, although later he did say we weren't actually holding him up, which was good news. As things got a bit rougher on the next few sections we pushed on a bit and were up to 19<sup>th</sup> at the first petrol halt back at Barton Mills. I checked the car over and all was well. Some were

fairing less well with several cars looking a bit battered.

Into the second leg, where there was probably half the mileage. Berner's Heath was the first section, a very rutted section to start with into a bit of rough forest at the end. The ruts were so big that poor Pete Riddle & Dave Bell got beached trying to turn round after missing a LWRT. Rally over for them 8. We did ok, but got caught by the same Nissan again on his second run and promptly got out of the way, although this time we kept a bit closer to him. We ended up 14th here, so much better. Then it was into a couple of long forest sections Kings Forest East & West. This was superb forest, but boy was it fast in places. A lot of the 90° corners had been dropped after they cut up badly last

year, which meant more long straights. This lead to speeds approaching 3 figures between the trees and I don't seem to have the bottle used to. We were 11<sup>th</sup> on the East side, but had a bit of a navigational hiccup on the West side. We followed the right route but poor Jonathan lost his bearings a bit and we had to stop and gather our thoughts a bit. We had just been through a PC manned by Howard Joynt so asked for a bit of guidance. He told us where we were and to get on with it. Thanks Howard. I guess we dropped a minute in there and were 19<sup>th</sup>.

Onto Ingham. A much shorter test then in previous years due to lack of road availability. Lots of stubble fields were used here to get the mileage. Usually it was along a track, into a field, round the edge of the field and back onto the track. The fields were very hard, and hence very fast, but the danger was a lot less, which meant it was more fun. The Rover was brilliant here, setting up nicely for each bend. Each time we got more and more sideways and got closer to the stake, eventually just knocking an arrow off. Good stuff. We started behind a fast Mk2 Escort, a bit too close as he showered us with stones off the start line. But soon we followed him round the stubble fields and were all over him. A nice quick 11<sup>th</sup> here.

The next section was a notoriously rough public track behind RAF Honington and this year was no different. Lots and bumps but no drama. 13<sup>th</sup>. The guy in the Escort ahead was the king of this section but could only manage 5<sup>th</sup>. Onto a new section round Euston Estate. This was very good with lots of variation here, from rocks to mud to sand. It went reasonably well apart from a bit of an overshoot and we were 9<sup>th</sup> quickest. If this section went well for the landowners they promise more mileage for the event next year. Then it was onto Shadwell Estate, and much of the same, farm tracks in varying states of roughness. 6<sup>th</sup> quickest.

Now onto the second petrol halt. There was a lot of waiting around as the time was a lot slacker than last year. After half an hour we were off again. Now into one of my favourites; Croxton Forest. Very fast and mostly smooth, with a few tight sections to catch us out. We had a few tank-slappers here as we tried quite hard. We were one of six crews to clean this section, so technically we were 1<sup>st</sup> equal here, although others probably completed it quicker. Then onto Larkshall, which combined a bit of everything: farm tracks, stubble fields, rough public whites, forestry and a bit of tarmac! It was really good in here, the car worked a treat on the stubble but we had some moments on the rough bit as a series of undulating bumps threw the car up and down and Jonathan struggled to hang on. The end was interesting as we had to go under a railway bridge with felt barely higher enough to clear the car. We both ducked as we went under! 6<sup>th</sup>



A long section next, Bridgham, which is partly public road, partly rough track and partly stubble. We started off ok, going under the A11 at great speed, then onto farm tracks before getting on to the road for a short while. There is a tiny little slot to take off this road, which is really hard to find. Just as we spotted it Clive in the Mk2 Escort can from the opposite way as he had missed it. We just nipped in front and managed to stay ahead early on but managed to put out quite a gap by the end, which were really pleased with. 7<sup>th</sup>

Just a few more to go. Back through Seven Hills, (was Shadwell) and Foxpin without drama. 4<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup> The final section was Dukes Ride, a really sting in the tail. With a new really rough bit and lots of

rough forest roads. We didn't do too bad here but were getting caught up on one track but lost the other car as he split onto the second lap. Poor Jonathan lost his place at one point, but with my knowledge of parts of the section we were able to get back on the map again. The new rough bit had some of the biggest bumps I have ever been over on the Preston, real big ones. The car was thrown up and down with some great big bangs felt right through the car. It was even enough to throw my wine gums out of the door pocket. Disappointing! We still finished 6<sup>th</sup> on this one so that was pretty good. We ended up finishing the event in sixth too, which was brilliant. We had kind of hoped for a top ten finish, so 6<sup>th</sup> was marvellous. We just missed out on the awards given to the top 5, but couldn't be too disappointed. This was the fastest Preston I have done, due to the dry conditions and the new route format to keep the event on time. It was good fun nonetheless and Jonathan did a great job. We may get together for other events next year, you never know.

Another year and a new organising team (well for this event) in charge for the third running of the New Year Treasure Hunt & Scatter. The organising team was to have been Julian & Sara but as Howard & Bernie had done all the work for last year's postponed September Scatter it was decided to save Julian & Sara for another day. This year the event is included in the Clubmans Series Championship for the first time. It had also been decided that the minimum number of entries for the event to be run (5) was to be strictly enforced and it was a relief to have received 6 entries by the cut off date; however it was a very pleasant surprise to find 13 crews waiting in the pub car park.

Our event did not get off to the best start. We were caught un-prepared when Howard handed out our paperwork at 12:01 on the dot resulting in a rather shambolic effort at getting the plots onto the map. Bit of a teaser to resolve before setting off with three choices for an overall game plan – should we head east, south or west – I'm not sure whether there was an optimum strategy as 3 hours later everyone had convinced themselves that they had picked the wrong choice! We (I) opted for the western option and I'm still convinced it might have been the best one but unfortunately Lady Luck dealt us a tough hand. The plan was to head west along the top of the map to the western most plot, return through Watton and then head back east through the A1075 / B1108 / A11 triangle towards the pub. This should have given us 27 clue locations to answer with the option to see how time was going when we got back to the east side of the map. Well we ended up visiting 20 clue locations, 11 of which we answered correctly, 3 nearly correctly and 2 not very correctly – we failed to find the actual clue location at 2 and obviously the wrong clue location at another 2. Highlight of the afternoon was leaving Watton with less than an hour to go having only visited 15 clue locations and my best estimate of being at least 30 minutes drive away from the pub. Well at least we made it back to the pub without any time penalties with a comfortable 15 seconds to spare! Oh yes, we did find our six treasures but failed to impress the judges with our presentation!

Overall it turned out to be quite a challenging event, in our case any hopes of visiting 30 clues vanished rapidly as I managed a very embarrassing wrong slot up a 'Church Only' white (although it did seem to entertain the locals who came out to watch Trevor reversing) at the third junction (just outside Barford) followed by a struggle to find the first clue in Barnham Broom – this sort of set the pattern for the rest of the afternoon. We then spent an age hunting for the clue on Kimberley Village Green and it then became obvious that finding the clue location 'somewhere' in the square was going to be tricky and local knowledge was probably going to play a part in the overall results. All things considered we had an entertaining afternoon, highlights being a weird game of hunt the garden in the centre of Watton and a rather desperate dash cross country from Watton to Colton (very desperate for one of the team as we hadn't managed any comfort breaks and in hindsight a cup of coffee at the start was perhaps not a good idea!).

The results showed Simon & Wendy victorious (by quite a margin after visiting 23 locations) with Paul & Katrina and Nick & Debbie a comfortable second. The results also showed that every clue location had been visited and answered correctly by at least one crew. Well done to Howard and Bernie for all their efforts.


Early application is requested so that we know how many are coming and which training streams are required so that we can cater accordingly.

Remember that to retain your Marshalling Grading you should receive formal, accredited training at least every other year.


