

Chairman is reporting October 2015

I often wonder if you get fed up with my monthly words of wisdom, but no worries I will still keep you up to date with the club motorsport world. In the way of things August was quite a quiet month we have been out and had a go at a couple of rallies to test the team and car before we go to Mull in early October.

The first rally was at Snetterton as you would have read about in last month's newsletter, our next saw the team heading west for the Mewla Rally, approximately 80 miles on the army ranges of the Brecon Beacons it has been a year since we had been on closed roads so I was

Christine, Simon and Dale gave the car a quick health check and top up with petrol before sending us on our way to the stages and

Since we formed the AMSC a couple of years ago with West Suffolk Motorsport Club and Eastern Counties Motor Club it has grown to a club with eight motor clubs forming the core to organise three different championships.

STUBBLE RACING IN VINTAGE BENTLEYS

OR - NOW FOR SOMETHING COMPLETELY DIFFERENT

On 3rd October, Dave Bell, Howard Joynt, Rob Henchoz (with members of his family) and Peter Riddle went marshalling on a motoring event rather unlike what SCCON members are used to. Called 'The Stubbler', it was organised by Benjafield's Racing Club, a club that "prefers" its members to own a vintage Bentley! It was held on and around R.G. Abrey Farms at East Wretham and former SCCON members Jim Bowie and Peter and Michelle Morgan were also part of the organising team.

The event comprised a number of timed tests, a regularity run and a scenic drive around the local countryside, The entry of twenty five cars included eight vintage Bentleys, two Lagondas, several post-vintage Bentleys, a Ford Model A and a Model T Special.

Julian Riley had entered as co-driver for his daughter Georgina in Julian's Dad's 1458cc six-cylinder Riley Mentone. Sarah Riley was co-opted at the last minute to navigate a 1929 Chrysler 75 roadster.

The first test used some loose surface tracks around the edge of a large field that will be familiar to Preston Rally and East Anglian Classic competitors. The next test had several changes of surface including sandy gravel, fresh grass and smooth concrete; at one point it even ran through the middle of a large farm building. A short road run took competitors to an all grass, forwards-only autotest around traffic cones which took a minute or so to complete. Immediately following was another, much longer, speed test on a huge stubble field with the route again marked out with cones and where Abreys Farms had cut the stubble short and rolled the ground which provided a fairly smooth surface to drive across. I suspect that driving over regular length stubble would have been very power-sapping even for the Bentleys.

A few cars were being piloted with some circumspection, given that they were over 80 years old, but most were being driven with gusto and it was enjoyable to watch the variety of driving styles. I was running the stop-line timing on the first stubble test, which got quite interesting



when three cars arrived almost together and another was looming over the horizon. Each car had to move forward smartly to clear the stop-astride finish line ready for the car immediately behind. Fortunately the Liege-type clocks can store multiple times so every codriver was given his or her correct time.

The next test was a drag race with a difference! It was uphill on stubble for about a third of a mile with cars starting in pairs a good distance apart for safety, but they were real drag races nevertheless. I can only guess at the speeds reached by the fastest Bentleys, but I think they must have got into top gear.

Then it was time for a very welcome buffet lunch in a large marquee near the end of the drag strip. Marshals were welcome to join the rally participants for lunch and this typified the very friendly and gentlemanly nature of the entire event.

After lunch there was a regularity run on public roads followed by more speed tests similar to, but not the same as, those held in the morning. The route for an untimed scenic drive included farm tracks and byways off the public highway that must have been closer to many country roads of the vintage period than our modern rural road network with tarmac almost everywhere.

When the results were published, Paul Carter and James Ewing were the overall winners in their 2-seater Derby Bentley, while SCCON's Sarah Riley had achieved an excellent third place and first placed vintage car in the Chrysler. Georgina and Julian finished eighth - a very creditable performance in a 1½ litre car when most of the opposition had engines two or three times the size. Julian summed up 'The Stubbler' as "a refreshingly different motoring event".


