

I have sent out the paper copy, Dave Bell has set up the web page entries and emailed out to previous entries. We have had our first entry and delivered on Monday morning by hand (a great start to our quest for a large entry)

Scottow report

Sunday saw a very sunny start to the 2016 <u>Anglia Motor Sport Club</u> Autosolo & Autotest Championships with Round 1 being held at <u>RAF Coltishall</u>, organised by the <u>Sporting Car Club</u> <u>of Norfolk</u>. This year it has been decided that all rounds will include an Autosolo, Autotest and Production Car Autotest which allows not only the normal road cars, but also drivers as young as 14 as well as non-road going cars to compete.

In the autosolo, class A1 (up to 1400cc) dominated taking 4 of the top 5 overall positions. Once again it was <u>West Suffolk Motorsport Club</u> members battling for the top spot with Vini Cruz, Duncan and Laura Christmas and Marcus Keeble being separated at times by less than a



second a test. It was Vini Cruz who came out on top taking Fastest Time of the Day, With Duncan taking 1st in Class, Marcus 2nd in Class and Laura closely behind in 3rd in Class. Greg Player and William Brown took 6th and 7th separated by just over a second, and new member Jasper Baker on his first event put in some very respectable times which improved throughout the day.

West Suffolk was also well represented in Class A2 (over 1400cc) with 6 of the 9 entrants. Hannah Ellis was quickest of these taking 3rd in Class, closely followed by Simon Sweetland in 4th and Alex Porter in 5th. The clubs secretary Neil Wackett was struggling with the test's and suffered with a number of wrong direction penalties as did Jeremy Judd and Colin Gray.

Class B (2 Seat Sports Cars) completely consisted of Mazda MX5's, and 9 of the 11 entrants were West Suffolk Members who took the top 5 spots. Kevin Lockwood finished 1st in Class closely followed by Leigh Gray in 2nd. Kayne Lockwood, Paul Webb and Will Pawsey took 3rd, 4th and 5th separated by only 5 seconds, and Andrew Smith came in at 7th winning the friendly battle with Mark Redgate who finished 9th. Daniel Marshall and Rebecca Lockwood were also struggling with the test layouts and picked up a number of wrong direction penalties putting them down in 10th and 11th in class.

Unfortunately, Mark Spriddell in class C retired, and we did not have any members competing in the Autotest, but it was fantastic to see a number of entries in the Production Car Autotest with West Suffolk Members Ben Maskell taking 2nd place, Darren Cansdale in 3rd, Cameron Maskell in 4th and Scott Cansdale in 8th.

It was also great to see competitors from 7 out of the 8 clubs which make up the <u>Anglia Motor</u> <u>Sport Club</u>.

There were:

24 competitors from <u>West Suffolk Motorsport Club</u> 9 competitors from <u>Sporting Car Club of Norfolk</u> 6 competitors from <u>Eastern Counties Motor Club</u> 4 competitors from <u>Kings Lynn and District Motor Club</u> 4 competitors from <u>Chelmsford Motor Club</u> 2 competitors from <u>Cambridge Car Club</u> and 1 competitor from Falcon Motor Club

Unfortunately one or two of the tests were a little too complicated which was causing a number of wrong direction penalties. For the newcomers it was particularly difficult but it was catching out even the most experienced drivers. Due to the number of entries and the size of the tests it was also necessary to cut the number of tests down from 18 to 12, but hopefully nobody was discouraged by the level of difficulty and we hope to see everyone at the next round on the 5th June at <u>MDPGA Wethersfield</u>, details of which will be published soon.

Plan D

Plans A and B had me competing, either driving with lan or navigating with Hugh, both binned early doors leaving plan C to navigate Paul as Course Closer. Plan D kicked in mid-afternoon on Friday following a call from Jonathan promoting me to the sharp end of the field replacing a sick and poorly Paul with a not quite so sick and poorly me in the left hand seat of car 1. Have to say that Mark coped well, although at times he must have wondered what he had let himself in for as I committed a string of rookie errors that a Novice would be embarrassed by!

Installed myself in the office pleased to find a comfy standard seat and all the usual electrical gubbins to make my life as easy as possible. Right out of the garage (thank you Jonathan) and some easy mental arithmetic for starters, well I'm sure Jonathan thought it was easy but as we all know men don't multi-task and my attempts at combining simple maths and map reading did nothing to disprove this myth! Found Andrew & Richard manning a PC just outside Lyng and then the first rookie error of the night. Triangles are always a challenge for newlyweds, instruction should have been miss a road on the right long way round triangle, this might have worked but unfortunately got my lefts and rights mixed up and it came out slot right long way round triangle on right, Mark showed great patience and we eventually found the board and carried on following the correct road. Bit of local knowledge helped here as one or two crews struggled to find the board, the triangle is a regular feature. Back to the route down the wiggly yellow through 0816, across the 1067 in Lenwade, left at River Fm, left at Great Witchingham church and onto Fiddler's Hill white (very happy that I didn't have to drive the Golf along here as it was always a bit on the rough side and didn't appear to have

mellowed), Chris & Susie were manning a PC at the exit, had Mark park here up while I double checked the route following a long stretch without a board. All seemed OK so we drove into TC2 manned by Paul & Rob.

String of 15 YYY, 1 YYYY, 2 YBB junctions and 1 SH out of TC2, looked a bit daunting at first, but again local knowledge helped and my first guess appeared to work. Serious doubts surfaced as we went a long way without a board, David on a manned PC early doors (Whitwell Hall) but then nothing on a 4 mile loop (Jordan Fm, B1145, Foxley Wood, Oaks Fm). Found a board under the disused railway then SH36 and Brick Kiln Fm towards the control. Fairly certain of the route but I was missing a YYY towards the end, Mark solved that one as he found a junction hiding under a green dot at Primrose Fm. Into TC3 manned by Phil & Peter still running first on the road, but that was all about to change.

It is no secret that I absolutely love grid references! What is not so well known is that I can't remember e 12 car using the maze of yellows around Wood Dalling that hasn't ended up with me lost. Parked up and even with Mark reading out the references I still managed to mis-plot 3 of them. John & lan took over first on the road here. Time for the first serious rookie mistake of the night, NEVER try plot & bash over the fold of a map – ALWAYS re-fold the map. What was turning into a bit of a nightmare section went seriously downhill as I sent Mark off on a very scenic detour towards Saxthorpe past Holly Heath Fm (that was after I made him have a look round the loop to the south of Foundry Hill, just in case). Eventually picked up the correct route (Wood Dalling, Crabgate, Norton Corner, Tyby, Norton Corner, Blackwater Br) into TC4 manned by Mike & Laurie with a healthy 8 minutes dropped.

Grid square entry and depart dots to TC5 and a section I never really got to grips with, shame really as a second look showed some quite nifty navigation with two possible routes in the middle. Still hadn't refolded the map, parked up at the first junction to put this right and relegated to third on the road as Mark & Ian sailed past. Arrived at a triangle in GS0629 expecting to find a board; nothing obvious. While Mark & I were chatting John & Ian appeared stage right, 3 point turn on the triangle and back where they had come from, meanwhile Mark had spotted the board well and truly run over lying in the grass on the triangle just about where John had just done his turn! Mark did his best to rebuild the board and must have done a good job as all following crews picked it up. Onwards to the next triangle in GS0529 and the position of the board meant we were going the wrong way, further re-enforced by Robert & David appearing down the road where I was trying to send Mark. Back track and the correct route found us another board on the Nethergate loop. Another 8 minutes dropped at TC5 manned by Neil.

A case of too much information with more grid square departs for the next section. Sort of a combination of grid squares and grid square departs, either would have been enough but the combination totally confused me. Very lucky that Mark was paying attention as he spotted Jez lurking on a triangle. We then had an interesting interpretation of a NAM from Jonathan, with a board on the short side of the triangle in GS0227, fortunately everyone spotted it, one or two worrying about off piste boards! Took Mark completely the wrong way through Foulsham, met Geoff & Nick following the correct route requiring a back track to find the board. Time for the second mega rookie mistake of the night. If you are expecting to use two maps on the night it is always a good idea to store the second map somewhere safe and accessible! Could well have ended the night helping the police with their enquiries into a lewd act performed in a parked car as Mark ended up with his head in my lap groping around searching for my copy of 132 that I had conveniently stored on the floor. Eventually found Howard & Maggy looking after TC6 with another 5 minutes dropped.

Relaxed section around Fakenham and the opportunity to recover 4 minutes. One or two crews were penalised at TC7 for too much make up. The time card was quite clear, maximum make up time is shown in the MU column this is calculated using the $\frac{3}{4}$ rule. Very simply the $\frac{3}{4}$ rule is there to stop organisers encouraging crews to speed. 8 mile section, 16 minutes at 30mph, max make up $\frac{1}{4}$ of 16 = 4. For sake of argument if 12 minutes MU was allowed on a 16 minute section then to benefit fully you would need to cover the 8 miles in less than 4 minutes which may actually be doable but certainly shouldn't be encouraged. Simple rule for makeup, if you aren't sure then don't.

Simple grid lines to TC8, or it should have been. Jonathan's intended route took in the white in GS9032 (PC manned by Richard & Andrew), the white in GS9034 (very smooth but a high crown which probably would have left the Golf well lightened at the PC manned by Peter), Sculthorpe, Dunton Patch, yellow loop in GS8729 finishing up at TC8 on the short white in GS8828 manned by Chris & Susie.

Mega herringbone to TC9 and the original finish of the event. Fairly uneventful, once the correct route out of TC8 was worked out. Only point of interest was following a land rover following a very slow moving police car along the B1146 for about a mile, and slow moving meant less than 30mph. PC manned by Howard & Maggy into TC9 manned by David.



Junction departs and a relaxed run back into Lyng to Jonathan at TC10 in the garage. Quietly through North Elmham, Worthing, Robertson Barracks, north of the Wensum, PC manned by Mike & Laurie, Mill Street Much better second half as we reduced our lateness to 12 minutes by TC10.

After my less than distinguished performance in the first half I was expecting a string of fails, pleasantly surprised to find us on the top step with a single fail as Jonathan read out the results. Even more surprised to find out we managed to pick up all the boards in the first half and our single fail was for missing Richard & Andrew on the first section of the second half. Jonathan deserves a medal for making any sense of the time cards on the night. Having spent a delightful 2 hours on Saturday afternoon followed by another 2 hours on Monday deciphering the hieroglyphics there has to be some comment made. Some cards were easier than others to read, but it was surprising how many boards were recorded on the wrong line. For anyone wishing to take the next step up to Nat B organisers are not so tolerant with boards, they expect the 6 or 7 digits to be recorded legibly and they certainly expect them in the correct place.


