

Here we were able to provide the entries and the classic marshal team with tea, coffee and bacon rolls while they were signing on ready for the day.

Everyone commented on the magnificent sight of the 120+ cars assembled in the bright sunshine. Before the start there were a few cars developing running or starting problems, but everyone did get on the road before our self-enforced deadline of 11.00 ish. The cars left the circuit via the bridge where Howard and Bernie ambushed them to stamp the road book as they reset their speedo ready to navigate the 85 miles of roads ahead. We had four stops planned on route this year.

Our first stop was just 15-16 miles into the run. It was the first time visit for any car club to TheInetham Windmill. Recently restored to its full black and white glory. Chris was our contact here, his team were a great help showing some 200+ visitors around their working mill. With the sails turning it made a magnificent sight. The adjoining field had its grass cut just for our classics to park on the day.

We moved on from the windmill to Elveden Courtyard where it would seem most of the Classics stopped to have a tea, coffee and some food. It was all quite busy as there was a Super Hero's children's event on at the same time, but all the staff coped very well (as Christine checked out the coffee shop for her cup of tea)

After the cars left Elveden there was a long drive to Gooderstone Water Gardens passing Qxborourgh Hall on the way. As with all the other stops we made sure all the Classics had the use of the comfort facilities. I think quite a number of the entrants stopped here too.

We then continued on the route heading for the finish at Pensthorpe Natural Park just outside Fakenham where most of our friendly team waited for the classic cars to arrive.
