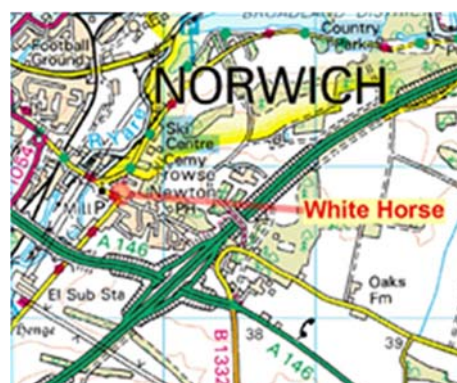



How to Tweet (No, not bird impressions)




In the last issue, I put together a guide on how to use Instagram. In this issue, we take a look at Twitter. As I said in the last edition, I know some of you might be a bit sceptical about the benefits of social media. I would say it's the future, but that's probably not entirely true as, in reality, it's the present, because it's well and truly taken over our lives.

This time I have put together a very brief guide on how to get started with Twitter. The big thing with Twitter is that you are limited to 280 characters, meaning you have to keep it simple! Even with this restriction, it remains a great way of keeping-up with the latest news, as most well-known drivers, teams and championships post regular updates.

To get started, go to www.Twitter.com or download the Twitter app to your smartphone or tablet. As with Instagram, you'll need to register an account so choose a username (this will be your "handle" that people follow) and you're ready to go. Below you will find a few hints on how to search and post (based around using a smartphone):

Searching for Users and Content		
		
<p>1. Tap the search button at the bottom of the screen (it looks like a magnifying glass) and type in the name of the account you're looking for, or even a topic like "motorsport" or "Vauxhall" etc etc.</p> <p>Tap on the account to open it.</p>	<p>2. If it's an account you're searching for, once you have selected it, it will take you to their home page.</p> <p>To follow that account, hit the "Follow" button (circled above).</p> <p>To view individual posts, simply tap on them. To "like" a post, just tap the heart symbol under it or, if you tap the speech bubble, you can add a reply.</p>	<p>3. Once you have followed a few accounts, a selection of their posts will appear in your feed every time you log-on. Twitter will also suggest content to you based on your searches, so you should see new stuff you find interesting.</p>

Posting Your Own Content

		
<p>1. Posting your own content is easy. Hit the blue “quill” symbol at the bottom-right of the page and you will automatically be taken to a new tweet. From here, just type your message.</p> <p>If you’d like to add a picture, the latest images on your device will show as previews at the bottom of the page, or you can take one using the camera.</p> <p>If you don’t want to add any pictures, you can just hit the “Tweet” button straight away.</p>	<p>2. If you want to select older pictures, hit the “Gallery” button and it will take you into the photos on your device.</p> <p>To choose a picture, simply tap on it. If you want to select more than one picture, on most devices, you should be able to hold down and it will select an image, then you can select others</p> <p>Twitter allows you to post up to four images at a time.</p> <p>Once you’re finished, hit the “Add” button.</p>	<p>3. One you’ve selected your pictures, they will appear below your text, so you can just type as before.</p> <p>As with Instagram, you can tag people by including their handle in your post text (make sure you use the “@” symbol at the start of their username, e.g. @SCCoNorfolk). Alternatively, tap “Who’s in this photo?” below your images and it will allow you to search for people.</p> <p>The last step is to add “hashtags” to your caption. This will help your posts to appear when people are browsing and searching. To add a hashtag, simply use the “#” symbol, followed by a suitable world, e.g. #motorsport. Make sure you add #SCCoN every time!</p> <p>Hit “Tweet” to finish.</p>

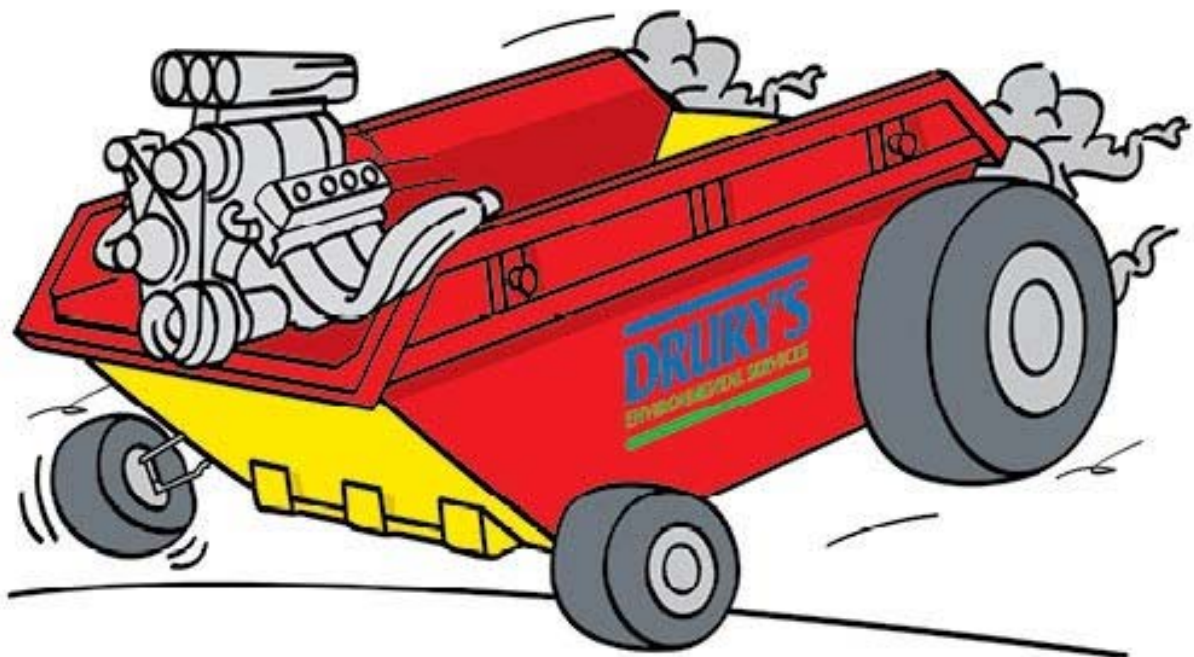
