

Event Report: Rallye Monte Carlo 2020

This year started with a rather special trip for me. I've always wanted to go to the Monte Carlo rally and, after Dan Gallant suggested we finally do it, I didn't need too much persuading! We were joined by our long-suffering better halves and another friend, Will for the trip, which saw us fly out to Nice on the Thursday the rally started. We collected our hire car from the airport and had a quick stop on the promenade before making the 3.5hr drive to our apartment, which was just outside Gap, birthplace of Sébastien Ogier and HQ for the rally.



The apartment itself was rather nice; modern and well appointed, though with slightly odd bathroom facilities. In

my mind, an en suite shower and toilet should be in a separate room, not actually in the bedroom itself! Anyway, that aside, it was a nice place, with beautiful views from the balcony.



One of my favourite things about rallying on the continent is just how welcoming everyone is, and the Monte was no different. We headed to SS2 and, when we parked the car in a small village, we stumbled across a village hall which was serving sandwiches and showing a live feed of the rally on a projector. There was barely a word of English spoken among the locals, but they couldn't have been more friendly.

SS2 itself was cold, muddy and dark, but we watched the first few cars through. While there wasn't any snow, the cars were pulling plenty of mud onto the road, so conditions were definitely a challenge. There is nothing quite like seeing WRC cars in the dark and they didn't disappoint. While it was Ogier that got the biggest cheer as he passed us, it was Belgium's Thierry Neuville that led going into Friday morning...

Speaking of Friday morning, we headed out to another stage following a quick trip to the supermarket for supplies. The conditions were still mostly dry, but that doesn't mean things were easy. You've probably seen Ott Tänak's crash by now but, if you haven't, I can assure you that it was a big one. Luckily the crew were ok, but their first race in the Hyundai was run.

For us Brits, there was plenty to cheer about. In their first rally in the Toyota Yaris, Elfyn Evans and Scott Martin were absolutely flying. A clean sweep of victories on Friday morning's stages gave them the rally lead and showed that their move out of the Fiesta was a wise one.





Following another stage, near Jarjayes, on Friday afternoon, we headed into Gap to find a more civilised meal. The town was much bigger than I expected, with some beautiful old buildings and, after some walking and pictures, we found a restaurant to enjoy some proper food and a drink or two. After that, it was back to the apartment and to bed, ready for our final full day.

Saturday saw us head south to the village of Selonnet, where there was a grandstand, catering and a band, again put on by the locals, with donations for the grandstand going to charity. We settled in to watch the cars come through the village and, again, the Toyotas were absolutely on it. The atmosphere in the stages was great, with big crowds wherever we went.

On Saturday afternoon, we ventured back to Gap to visit the service park and, while we missed the cars, it is always interesting to have a look around and check out the glamorous end of rally servicing. Hyundai's service area never ceases to amaze me – they literally erect a building at every rally! We picked up some mementos and then headed back to the apartment for a more relaxed evening in readiness for an early start back to the airport on Sunday morning. We didn't catch the Sunday stages due to this, but they were much closer to Monte Carlo, so not really very convenient and would have required an extra day on the trip.





Sadly, Evans wasn't able to hold on to the lead on Sunday. Despite adapting to the Yaris quickly, he wasn't totally comfortable on the final leg, relinquishing the lead to the flying Thierry Neuville and his Toyota team-mate, Ogier. Still, a great first outing. I think Evans is a shoe-in for a win or two in 2020.

Overall, it was a fantastic trip and definitely an item ticked off the bucket list. If you haven't seen the current crop of WRC cars in the metal, I would really urge you to try and get to an event. They are absolute monsters and, with hybrid rules coming for 2022, it's unlikely that we will ever see their like again.



The seminar is primarily aimed at anyone involved in running (or thinking of running) events including Club Stewards, Secretaries of the Meeting, Unlicensed Clerks, Competition Secretaries, etc. etc.

Representatives from all disciplines are very welcome the content being applicable generally. It's also a great opportunity to pick up ideas from other events.

Newcomers are especially welcome as the seminars provide a fantastic opportunity to develop and share knowledge and experience with other Club Officials and Event Organisers in the region.
