The bars fly around the large internal space of the barn to warm up and stretch their wings, before leaving the building at dusk to hunt. | 12b | 1753 | 'Owd Sir Berney' Berney Brograve inherited Waxham in 1753, In 1775 he decided to run the estate directly, rather than rent the land to tenants. His direct involvement may explain Why local people came to fear and dislike him so much. |

| 12c | 15,000 | Thatch Thatch is an ancient type of roof covering for buildings. In the past many different materials have been used, such as heather and sedge. In this part of Norfolk, reed was freely available in the surrounding marshes. Reed is thought to be the best material for thatch because of its strength and durability. The roof here needed completely re-thatching in the 1990s repair. The underside of the thatch was lined with woven reed called fleeking. This can be seen inside the barn, and on the undersides of the single storey wings. The barn has one of the longest thatched roofs in the country. It took the thatcher a year to complete using 15,000 bundles of Norfolk reed. |
